Invisible Electronic Waste

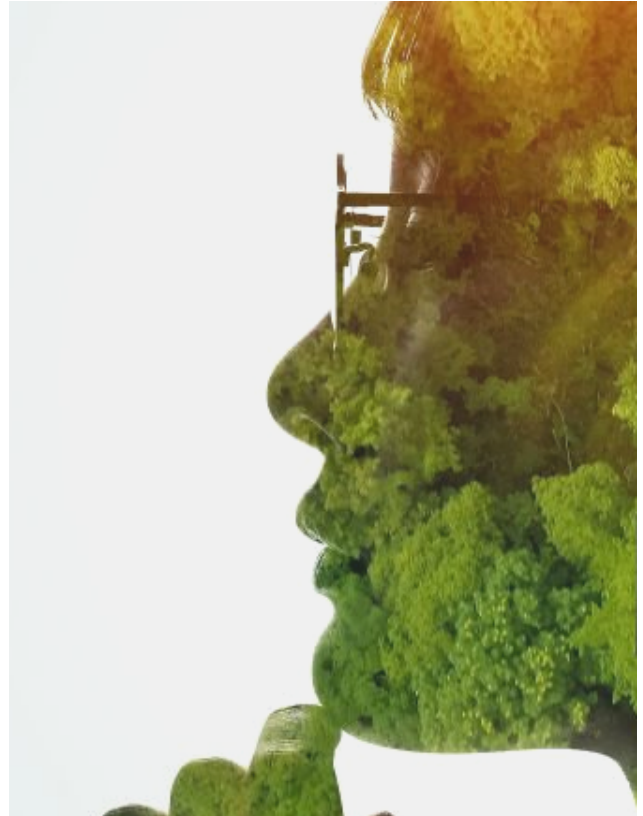
What can we do to reduce, reuse or recycle electronic waste in schools and VET companies?

Challenge



We all use computers, mobile phones and tablets — but few of us think about what happens when they stop working. Electronic waste (e-waste) is one of the greatest environmental threats of the 21st century. This challenge aims to develop solutions that reduce technological waste and promote the reuse of equipment in schools and communities.



How can we reduce the environmental impact of electronic waste and promote the reuse of technological equipment in our schools and communities?

Teams can create collection and repair systems, educational campaigns on device recycling, or digital platforms that encourage reuse and reconditioning.

2. **Sustainability and impact – real contribution to the environment.**
3. **Feasibility and applicability – can it be implemented in a school or company?**
4. **Teamwork and communication – cooperation and clarity in the pitch.**
